Education: Safe Sleep Ambassador Available in Spanish



safe sleep education curriculum. This free, self-paced on-line module is available on any internet enabled device. Updated to reflect 2022 AAP Safe Sleep recommendations, It is appropriate for caregiver/parent education, and other non-clinical infant safe sleep advocates and supporters. After successful completion of the module and a brief post-test, a certification of completion is generated. Since its launch, over 53,000 people have become Safe Sleep Ambassadors. For the first time, the Safe Sleep

Research: The Tension Between AAP Guidelines & Infant Sleep

Last month we shared the important article, Characteristics of SUID **PEDIATRICS** on Shared & Nonshared Sleep Surfaces. Since its publication, there


have been many discussions across social and traditional media, noting that over 60% of SUID infants were sharing a sleep surface. Just as we saw the reduction of infant deaths drop from 10,000 annually to 3,400 with the introduction of "Back to Sleep", we would hope to see this same reduction as we continue to learn how fatal bed and surface sharing proves for babies. In their article published in April's Pediatrics, Drs. Moon et al discuss the tensions and challenges mothers report regarding the ABCs and infant safe sleep. Information from last month's article and now this month's publication, demonstrates just how important the work you and your hospital teams do to support infant safe sleep continues to be.

Dr. Moon recently explained that baby's rib cage is not rigid, so it doesn't take a lot of pressure to press on it and create obstruction making it harder to baby to breathe and for baby's heart to beat properly when there is pressure on there. 
