

As we start the new year, Cribs for Kids counts 456 hospitals as Safe Sleep Certified. There

are 60 active applications under review for hospitals seeking initial or recertification.

From a joint press release issued by the Consumer Federation of America (CFA), Keeping Babies Safe, Kids in Danger (KID), and Safe Infant Sleep, we learned that the CPSC has voted unanimously (4-0) to publish a final rule for crib mattresses. By including aftermarket

mattresses in the rule, it will eliminate supplemental mattresses that are intended to be added to mesh play yards in addition to non-full size rigid cribs. All aftermarket mattresses will have to be essentially the same as the original mattress that is sold with the play yard.

Replacement mattresses are to be sold to replace a previous mattress; not sold as an

"We filed this petition in 2015 to ban dangerous after-market and supplemental mattresses and have worked tirelessly to educate regulators, lawmakers and consumers about its dangerous misuse, as a clear and evident safety hazard," Davis said. We look forward to the day the standard is in effect."


